

Safe Scouting

All shootings sports will be conducted under the direct supervision of a CSR Range Supervisor.

To ensure a safe Scouting experience, units will provide a minimum of two adult leaders (21+) for each shooting sports activity that is being used. Units may provide instructors who meet the qualifications below to run additional programs simultaneously. Instructors must be approved in advance by the CSR Range Director.

Cub Scouts

Archery - Must be conducted by trained, qualified on-site range officers who actually direct the operation of the range program and archery instruction. To qualify as an archery range officer, the range officer must be at least 18 years old and be trained by an NCS certified Shooting Sports Director or a National Archery Association instructor.

BB Shooting - Must be conducted by trained, qualified on-site range officers who actually direct the operation of the range program and BB shooting instruction. To qualify as a BB gun range officer, the range officer must be at least 18 years old and be trained by a NCS certified Shooting Sports Director or a NRA instructor.

Boy Scouts/Venturing

.22 Rifle/Shotgun - Must be conducted by trained, qualified on-site range officers who actually direct the operation of the range program and rifle/shotgun instruction. To qualify as a range officer, the range officer must be at least 21 years old and hold a current BSA NCS, NRA or law enforcement instructor certification. **NOTE:** Instructor certification must be in specific area being supervised (ie: shotgun-specific)

Archery - Same as Cub Scout

Muzzleloader - CSR Range Director only

Pistol - For Venture Scouts ONLY

Shooting Sports Program – Units

Cub Scout Program

Archery - \$5 per Scout

1 hour program includes unlimited use of arrows, bows, targets and target stands.

BB Gun - \$5 per Scout

1 hour program includes use of BB guns, paper targets and unlimited ammunition.

Boy Scout Program

Archery - \$5 per Scout

1 hour program includes unlimited use of arrows, bows, targets and target stands.

Rifle - \$8 per Scout

Includes use of rifles, paper targets and 20 rounds per Scout.

Shotgun - \$15 per Scout

Includes use of shotguns, clay skeet, and 15 rounds ammunition per Scout.

Muzzleloader - \$10 per Scout

Includes use of rifle, targets and 5 shots per Scout.

Venturing Program

Archery - \$5 per Venture Scout

1 hour program includes unlimited use of arrows, bows, targets and target stands.

Rifle - \$8 per Venture Scout

Includes use of rifles, paper targets and 20 rounds per Scout.

Shotgun - \$15 per Venture Scout

Includes use of shotguns, clay skeet, and 15 rounds ammunition per Scout.

Muzzleloader - \$10 per Venture Scout

Includes use of rifle, targets and 5 shots per Scout.

Pistol - \$8 per Venture Scout

Includes use of pistols, targets, 60 air pistol shots or 60 .22 shots per Scout.



Safe Scouting

All shootings sports will be conducted under the direct supervision of a CSR Range Supervisor.

To ensure a safe Scouting experience, units will provide a minimum of two adult leaders (21+) for each shooting sports activity that is being used. Cub Scouts

Archery - Must be conducted by trained, qualified on-site range officers who actually direct the operation of the range program and archery instruction. To qualify as an archery range officer, the range officer must be at least 18 years old and be trained by an NCS certified Shooting Sports Director or a National Archery Association instructor.

BB Shooting - Must be conducted by trained, qualified on-site range officers who actually direct the operation of the range program and BB shooting instruction. To qualify as a BB gun range officer, the range officer must be at least 18 years old and be trained by a NCS certified Shooting Sports Director or a NRA instructor.

Boy Scouts/Venturing

.22 Rifle/Shotgun - Must be conducted by trained, qualified on-site range officers who actually direct the operation of the range program and rifle/shotgun instruction. To qualify as a range officer, the range officer must be at least 21 years old and hold a current BSA NCS, NRA or law enforcement instructor certification. NOTE: Instructor certification must be in specific area being supervised (ie: shotgun-specific)

Archery - Same as Cub Scout

Muzzleloader - CSR Range Director only

Pistol - For Venture Scouts ONLY
